The Way of Jesus JOHN 17:1-26

Passage

Background info about the author, audience, style, etc. that may be of help.

- John 17 is commonly referred to as "The High Priestly Prayer". It is made of three sections.
 - First, Jesus prays to the Father for Himself. He reports of how He has done all that God gave Him.
 - Second, Jesus prays for His disciples. He asks that they may be one, be filled with joy, keeping them in the Father's name and from the world, and that they would be sanctified as they go into the world.
 - Third, Jesus prays for all future believers. The central theme of this prayer is that all believers would be unified. Jesus shows that the result of this unity would be that the world would know that Jesus was sent by the Father. Jesus also prays that all disciples would be with Him (v. 24). This goes back to His definition of eternal life in verse 3, "And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent."
- Most people are familiar with the phrase, "in the world, not of the world". Verses 15 and 16 are where that idea comes from.
- Unity is the overarching theme of Jesus' prayer. The unity among the disciples and eventually all believers in a display of the unity between the Father, Son, and Spirit.
- Jesus refers to the Father as "Holy Father" (v. 11). This is the only time in the New Testament that God the Father is referred to by this name. In the same way that God is Holy, He calls us to be holy (sanctified).
